There's no place like home!

Maths

Number and place value: Revision of numbers to 100. We will practise counting orally and practically with objects. We will do this forwards and backwards from any given number in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s.

Addition/Subtraction: Let's add and subtract 1 and 2 digit numbers and solve problems.

<u>Shape and Measures:</u> We will measure, record and solve problems. We will use mathematical language to compare.

Science

We will continue to observe and study the seasons changing.

We will compare and contrast the habitats of the animals in our story and learn about other animals and plants that live in those environments. We will name, label and compare common plants and animals. We will challenge ourselves by finding animals that can live in more than one habitat.

P.E.

In Gymnastics we will work on floorwork and balancing on 'points and patches'. We will continue to challenge ourselves on our 'balance bikes'. We will create a thematic dance.

Year I-Term 3

Geography

We will look at the similarities and differences between the town and the countryside. Year One will identify and name geographical features and sort human and physical features. We will use photographs, maps, and 'Google Maps'. We will conduct a focused study of Coalway.

Computing

Year One will program 'Beebot' to travel 'out and about'. We will learn about sequences of instructions, how to predict the outcomes of sequences and how to find and correct errors.

Music

We will be studying pulse, rhythm and pitch.

RE/PSHE

We will learn about community and belonging to groups eg our family, our school or a club. We will learn about belonging to a faith eg Christianity and Judaism. We will identify the key symbols of these faiths. We will focus on how we help each other.

English

Reading. Our focus text is: 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse'. We will be reading non-fiction texts related to homes long ago and plants/animals from various habitats.

Phonics Year One will work on the split digraph phonemes and all the alternatives, ea oi and ow.

Writing Non-fiction: we will write recipes and instructions. We will make a variety of lists of animals, homes and plants. Fiction: Year One will orally re-tell the story of 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse' using our 'story hands' and make story maps. We will make character profiles.

In handwriting, we will continue to work on the letter 'families' and practise the patterns in 'Write Dance'. We will begin to learn how to join groups of letters. Speaking and Listening/Drama – oral storytelling, answering questions and justifying our answers.

Role play - in our class cafe.


Technology

Art


We will match and sort fabrics and threads for colour, texture, length, size and shape.
