

## Handwriting at Coalway Infant School

## In Classes One and Two


Children will learn how to form letters correctly, with clear difference between letter height and the correct formation and orientation. We practice our gross and fine motor skills, coordination, balance and core strength and we work on handwriting patterns and movements in our dance sessions called 'Write Dance'. When learning the formation of letters we use the rhymes from Ruth Miskin's 'Read, Write, Inc.' scheme. (See below.)



This shows exactly how we form our letters in Classes One and Two and where each letter begins.



Then, we concentrate on the 'letter families' so that the children can see the similarities between how some letters are formed.



## Classes Three and Four

We continue to learn about the letter families and ensure that we are forming them correctly. When we are ready we begin to learn about cursive (joined) letters and introduce this to the children by learning how to join our digraphs in our phonics lessons.



Next, we learn about the 'lead in' and 'lead outs' of letters.



## Classes Five and Six

In terms One and Two, we continue to work on the letter families, joined digraphs and 'lead ins' and 'lead outs' of letters. By Terms Three and Four the children are encouraged to join letters all the time, in all pieces of work (not just when we are concentrating on handwriting). Finally we also learn about the letters we don't wish to join eg. capitals.
