## Geography/ Computing

Go for a walk around your local area. Point out places of interest eg church, park. Draw/take a picture of one of these places. **Challenge:** Can you find these places on 'Google Maps'?

## RE/PSHE

Belonging to different groups. What do you do with your family/friends on the weekend? Do you go to a club/church/have Sunday lunch/watch a film together/watch or play sport? Please draw or take a picture.

## PE /Technology

Keeping fit and healthy.  
What can you do / eat to keep fit and healthy? With your family, do some simple fitness exercises at home eg, skipping, jogging, jumping, riding a bike etc Can you plan / make a healthy snack? You could take a photo or draw a design showing your ideas. Have fun!

## Science/Maths/ English

Can you plant a seed in a tray /pot or in the ground and look after it? How could you measure its growth? **Challenge:** Can you write a set of instructions for planting a seed? Can you use sequencing words? (first, next, then, after, finally)  
You could draw pictures or take photos.
