



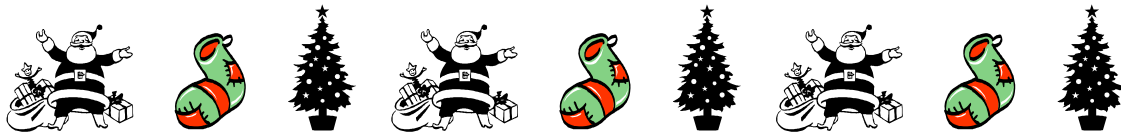

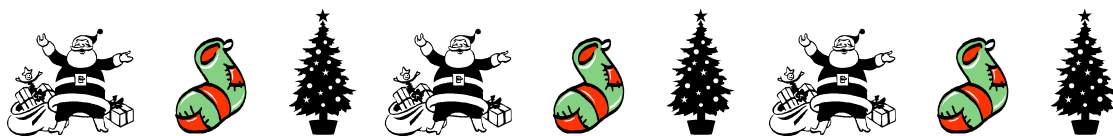

Year 1 Christmas Concert

At this time every year, Classes 3 and 4 usually perform a Christmas concert for their parents. As we are unable to invite anyone in to school due to COVID guidelines, Class 3 and 4 staff are currently busy trying to put together an alternative virtual concert for Year 1 parents (and us all as well!!)

Please look out for notification towards the end of term that this is ready... the children are looking forward to presenting 'A Wiggly Nativity' to you!



(For the information of our Reception parents: Each year group performs a concert for their parents during the course of the year. Classes 1 & 2 will perform concerts for their parents towards the end of the Spring term, and Classes 5 & 6 will perform a Leavers concert for Year 2 parents in July).

Christmas Dinner



The children will be having their Christmas dinner on Friday 11th December – a traditional roast turkey dinner (with chipolata sausage, sage and onion stuffing, peas, carrots, roast potatoes, gravy), followed by a gingerbread biscuit or chocolate orange brownie. Anyone requiring the vegetarian option of Parsnip and Sweet Potato Loaf should have requested this option at the School Office a week in advance of this, by Friday 4th December.

Christmas Jumper Day



The children may wear their Christmas tops/jumpers/dresses/leggings on Christmas dinner day as Friday 11th December is national Christmas Jumper Day whereby money is raised for 'Save the Children'. If you wish to donate, a donation of 50p would be gratefully received for the charity.



Christmas Parties

The children's Christmas parties will be held on Tuesday 15th December. School Fund will be covering the cost of food and prizes to be bought for each class party.

As we are unable to hold a family Christmas disco this year, we thought the children might like to wear their party/disco clothes to school on this day; otherwise they may wear normal school uniform if they would prefer.

On disco night we also normally offer the children the chance to have a tattoo, their nails painted or have a go at the lucky dip. So on party day this year staff will give the children the opportunity to do all 3! If you would prefer your child not to have a Christmas tattoo or they have an allergy that prevents this, please email the school to let us know in advance.



Christmas Service

As a whole school we will be making a virtual Christmas Service for everyone to share in. This will follow our usual format of telling the Christmas story through readings and carols. This will be published in the last week of term – again, please look out for notification in due course.

Christmas Cards

Unfortunately, the children will be unable to bring in cards for their classmates this year (due to COVID restrictions and GCC advice). However, as an alternative, we thought they may like to make an e-card or picture instead and send it to their class via Purple Mash. The staff will then print out any cards/messages received and share and display them in the classroom for the children. The teachers will add information about how to do this on to Purple Mash for you.

Adverse Weather Conditions

As winter approaches please can we remind you about our general procedures regarding possible school closure in the event of severe weather:

1. Closure of the school will be posted on the school website www.coalway-inf.gloucs.sch.uk
2. If there is heavy snowfall overnight you will be contacted by text to your mobile phone by 8.15 a.m. the next day informing you of closure of the school.
3. If you have not received a text message you may check by telephoning the school after 8.30 a.m. to check if the school is open.
4. Listen to Radio Gloucestershire - FM 104.7 and/or Severn Sound - FM 102.4; AM 774. They will give news about school closures.
5. Access the Gloucestershire website to view the list of schools that are closed

6. It may be necessary for the school to close during the course of the day. In that case, it is very important that we have an emergency contact number as a text message will be sent in the first instance.

COVID procedures

Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe and for doing your bit to 'stop the spread'. You are all doing a fantastic job in very difficult circumstances ... and with a smile! Please keep going! As we spend more time indoors during the Autumn/Winter, the possible risk of transmission will increase so everyone's vigilance is vital.

Remember:

- Increase hand washing and hygiene practices
- Limit mixing with others
- Keep your distance from others
- Keep checking everyone in the household for coronavirus symptoms and react accordingly;
- If a child/parent/family member in the household presents with any symptoms of coronavirus, check the NHS website and book a test as soon as possible. Do not go out or come to school. Anyone you live with must also stay at home until you get your result.
- Keep school informed of reasons for absence and of test results, so that we can take appropriate action
- Wear a mask or visor at drop off and collection times
- Only one adult should come on to site to drop off/collect each child
- Drop off/collect your child at any time during their class '10 minute window' to reduce contact with others
- Don't arrive early and overlap with other class drop off times
- Keep your child by your side whilst waiting at class designated areas and when on pathways
- Keep a 2m distance from staff when they open classroom doors and avoid blocking entrances for the children entering their classrooms...Pass on important messages via email/telephone if you can.
- Drop your child off and go – don't stop to chat with friends or relatives in accordance with national guidance re. mixing outside of households
- Follow the one-way system to enter/leave site

Thank you for your continuing support. Our school community's safety is our paramount concern - with everyone's support, we can continue to safeguard the children, yourselves, the staff and all our families and minimise spread of the virus in the wider community. Thank you.
