Art and Design We will explore texture and pattern in the environment. We will study the work of Andy Goldsworthy and will be creating our OWN sculptures using natural materials.

Mathematics

We will continue to build our knowledge of:

*numbers to 100 (reading, writing, ordering)

*number bonds to 10/20 (addition and subtraction)

We will also learn and apply new skills in:

*Partitioning numbers into tens and ones

*Multiplication- counting equal sets and groups of objects (addition arrays)

*Division- sharing sets of objects into groups.

*Describing position and direction (vocabulary used)

Computing

We will continue to practise our keyboard and mouse control skills.

We will focus on algorithms - programming and debugging instructions. We will be using the program 260 and the Beebots.

We will also continue work on e-safety.

English

Our focused text this term is 'The Gruffalo'.

Phonics: We will continue to practise our segmenting and blending skills in reading and writing activities. We will be focusing on long vowel sounds and word endings. Writing: We will continue to practise our sentence writing skills, using descriptive words / phrases and connecting our ideas using 'and' / 'because'. We will also practise writing labels, captions, lists and recounts.

We will be sharing a range of stories, poetry and non-fiction texts related to our topic.

Reading: We will begin to introduce group guided reading texts and comprehension activities.

RE and PSHE

We will look at and discuss special objects that help Christians and Jewish people in their worship.

Geography
