My poem was all about camping because it is my favourite hobby! Bella




I will treasure the book forever! George

Thank you to all parents who supported the event.


We enjoyed a day of sporty activities and we raised an amazing £261.40!!

Classes 1,2,3 and 4 thought about what makes a good friend and made pictures and wrote about one of their friends.








We loved Class 3's string of friends all holding hands together!




We were so proud of the children in Classes 3 & 4 who performed such wonderful concerts for their families and friends.




Such wonderfully talented children. Brilliant singing and acting. A pleasure to watch and enjoy!


SCHOOL ELECTION


