# **Attendance & Punctuality**



Thank you to all parents who telephone or call in to let us know of their child's absence. This is a significant help to the staff and ensures that appropriate absence records are kept for your child. As part of our attendance procedures Mrs. Nash or Mrs. Edwards may telephone you at home if we are unsure of a reason for absence.

To raise parents' awareness of their child's attendance to date this academic year we have attached a printout of their attendance. This identifies their percentage attendance since September and the number of authorised and unauthorised absences which your child has. Also listed is the number of sessions your child has attended – remember that there are two sessions per day, a morning and an afternoon session.

We are extremely proud of **36** of our children who achieved 100% attendance for terms 1 and 2 – all received special certificates during certificate assembly this morning for such a fantastic achievement. Furthermore, another **83** children achieved attendance of 95% or better, meaning that overall an incredible **70%** of children in the school achieved attendance of 95% or better!

It is also important that all children arrive promptly every day and we would remind some parents that the teachers welcome the children into their classrooms from 8.50 a.m. ready for a 9.00 a.m. start. Classroom doors/outside area entrance gates are locked at 9.00 a.m. prompt. Any parent who is later than the 9.00 a.m. start should use the main entrance door and register their lateness with a reason at the School Office. Your attendance printout identifies the number of late registration marks your child has had this year.

The school monitors regularity of lateness and absence carefully, with referrals made for persistent absenceism or lateness, the Government figure for persistent absence being below 90%.

# **Holiday Absence Regulations**

Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence for holiday during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Parents will find full guidelines in our policy on the school's website, or alternatively may ask for a copy at the School Office.



### **Term Dates**

Parents will find term dates until the end of this academic year listed at the end of this newsletter. Term dates are also available on the school's website www.coalway-inf.gloucs.sch.uk. All term dates are in conjunction with the Junior School and Coalway Early Years.



As winter approaches please can we remind you about our general procedures regarding possible school closure in the event of severe weather:

- 1. Closure of the school will be posted on the school website www.coalway-inf.gloucs.sch.uk
- 2. If there is heavy snowfall overnight you will be contacted by text to your mobile phone by 8.15 a.m. the next day informing you of closure of the school.
- 3. If you have not received a text message you may check by telephoning the school after 8.30 a.m. to check if the school is open.
- 4. Listen to Radio Gloucestershire FM 104.7 and/or Severn Sound FM 102.4; AM 774. They will give news about school closures.
- 5. Access the Gloucestershire website to view the list of schools that are closed <a href="https://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/closures/">www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/closures/</a>
- 6. It may be necessary for the school to close during the course of the day. In that case, it is very important that we have an emergency contact number as a text message will be sent in the first instance. (N.B. It is very helpful to us when parents keep each other informed as we have no guarantee of 100% coverage with the text message service).

#### **Head Lice**

Information on Head Lice is published in the newsletter at the beginning of every second term in line with the advice issued by the Gloucestershire Health Protection Unit. **It is each parent's responsibility to check hair at least once a week and to treat if necessary.** Please find below Local Authority information which we advise parents to read carefully. The advice, briefly, is as follows:-


- An attempt should be made to remove the head lice by repeated combing of wet hair using a plastic head louse detector comb. Combs are available from pharmacies. Plastic head louse detector combs must be used.
- If this fails to clean the headlice infestations, parents should contact the Health Centre (0300 4218850) for a recommended lotion or further advice can be obtained from the school nurse via the same number.

It is most important that ...

- you check your child(ren)'s hair on a regular basis and follow this advice
- long, loose hair should be tied back to reduce the risk.

#### **Administration of Medicine**

We prefer not to give medicine to children during the course of the school day but, if it is absolutely essential that your child receives medication (i.e. to complete a course of antibiotics), arrangements may be made for staff to administer the necessary medication through agreement with Mrs Hamilton. For legal and safety reasons, parents will be required to complete and sign a short agreement form for the school to administer the medicine – all enquiries should be directed to the School Office.



A reminder that this popular club runs every Wednesday morning between 8.30 a.m.-8.50 a.m. - All welcome. We would ask that children arrive promptly, for an 8.30 a.m. start, to avoid disruption. Thank you.
